#### Alfa News Notes and Miscellanea

#### Alfa's U.S. Sales Soldier On

FCA reported sales of 1,017 Alfas in June. No doubt almost all of them were new Giulia deliveries. This makes a total of 3,717 delivered year-to-date. June sales were about 100 higher than the May reported numbers in a month that saw the overall market dip by 3%. Still, Alfa has a long way to go to catch the other brands in its segment. They're counting on the arrival of the Stelvio in late August or early September to boost interest and sales penetration.

The good news? You're not likely to see another Giulia like yours on the road right now unless you're on the way to the North American Convention.

#### Palmen Alfa Kenosha Shows Expansion Plans

#### We Scheduled a Strike but Nobody Came



Italians workers and unions are famous for their strikes, but apparently the prospect of full employment and a regular paycheck can have a dampening effect on the reform movement.

The union representing Italian auto workers called for a June 30 strike at the Cassino plant to protest the production rate and express solidarity for their fellows facing layoffs in other FCA plants.

Surprise! The Cassino assembly line workers were too busy working full shifts assembling Giulias and Stelvios to think about striking. Of the 1,600 workers affected, only four voted to strike. A second round of voting found 1 in 1,100 votes. So much for solidarity. (Source: ClubAlfa.it)

#### Alfas at Auction - June

Greenwich, Connecticut, is the site of the Greenwich Concours d'Elegance. This year's event, held June 3 and 4, was the 22nd for this well-established event. Actually, the concours is two shows in one, with American cars and motorcycles featured Saturday and the Concours International for imported marques presented Sunday. Bonhams is the sponsoring auction and it is in its tenth year of offering collector cars and collectibles in conjunction with the concours.

The Sunday auction grossed \$7,380,000 with a 92 percent sell-through rate. The ninety or so automotive consignments seemed to cover just about every collectible auto taste from Chrysler Crossfire to Ferrari F40, the latter, at \$880,000, being the top seller at the auction. The Ferrari was followed in the top five sales by two Bugattis, an Aston Martin, and a Bentley.



There were two Alfa Romeos offered this year, a **Giulia Spider** and a Montreal. The Spider, a **1963**, AR372724, was done up in the typical red with black upholstery. It was described at a well-cared-for example, in the ownership of a single enthusiast for 25 of its 54 years. Originally sold in the U.S., the consignor claimed a comprehensive restoration in the early 1990s. It was said that the restorer sought to keep the car as original as possible. Unlike some cars subjected to such a restoration, the Spider didn't suffer the indignity of becoming a garage queen, and is said to have been used and maintained regularly since its restoration.

The auction company photos show a Spider that presents as a very well maintained, high quality driver. There are no obvious finish flaws and the gaps, though generous, are consistent and as-delivered. The

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630-553-9023 sbcinc@aol.com trim appears complete and well-finished, with some added edge protectors around the front grill and eyebrows. The two Talbot-style side mirrors provide some evidence that this restoration was intended to be driven. The old-style Italian plates bearing the car's serial number are a nice touch.

One doesn't always see photos of the underside of a car but Bonhams was wise to include some for this Spider. The chassis looks very sound, clean, and not over-restored, showing signs of use but not abuse. Yellow aftermarket springs are visible and an electric fuel pump has been added, otherwise everything appears stock. The Giulia rides on a set of Vredestein Sprint Classics, a desirable choice for a car meant to be driven rather than shown.



The engine compartment was very close to showworthy, being very clean and mostly authentic, with only one or two deviations from originality.

Perhaps the weakest element of the car was the interior. It wasn't awful, in fact it was quite nice, just not up to the standard set by the rest of the car. It was let down most by the dash covering and seat upholstery. The dash covering had that overstuffed look, as did the seats, looking like each was redone over the old materials, rather than properly replaced. The instruments were serviceable if not gem-like. A plus was the fitting of the proper rubber mats rather than the often-used and incorrect carpeting.

Despite all this nit-picking, in my opinion the Spider deserved the winning bid of \$68,200, squarely in the center of the auctioneer's estimate and just above the median price in the latest *Sports Car Market Pocket Price Guide*.

The Bonhams-offered **Montreal** was a **1971** model, SN AR142526, with gold livery and beige interior. Its history is interesting, if somewhat sketchy. According



to the consignor the car was first delivered new to Genoa, Italy. The car then turns up in France circa 1983. The French owner intended to give the car a full restoration but never completed the job. Another enthusiast subsequently bought the car, which was auctioned by Bonhams in 2011 painted red but with its original interior and described as a solid project car. Sometime between 2011 and 2014 the car finally underwent a full restoration in Italy and was shipped to the United States by the consignor. There are further records of additional work in 2016. Sadly, the car was driven only about 500 km since its 2016 service.

The auction photos show a car with a good finish and good trim. Although it may only be a trick of lighting, the doors, especially the left, look like they were repainted or painted apart from the car. This is a condition someone would have to judge in person.

The engine compartment is clean and tidy but not up to concours presentation. One peculiarity, considering the stated history, is the appearance of a German serial number tag on the inner fender. Certainly, these were only applied to cars intended for sale in Germany. (?)



Montreals weren't offered with air conditioning until sometime in 1972 so this car doesn't have that complication, nor does it have a radio installed. I suppose this makes it a "stripper" Montreal, as far as options go. That said, the interior is let down only by a lifting upper dash panel. Everything else appears to be in order.

This example of Alfa's often underrated supercar sold for \$70,400, somewhat under the auction estimate, but in line with other recent sales.

Alfa sales at live auctions were otherwise few and far between in June but Mecum and Barrett-Jackson squeezed one each in among the muscle cars they more commonly offer.

On June 16 in Portland, Mecum sold a **1987 Spider Quadrifoglio**, in red with gray leather, complete with hardtop. This looked like a good, serviceable, driverquality car, nicely worn in, with no major faults other than the swirl marks visible in the finish and with no outstanding plusses, either. The odometer showed just short of 60,000 miles and a later stereo had been fitted. The Spider sold for \$6,500, a typical price for a typical Spider.



Finally, Barrett-Jackson held its 2nd annual Northeast Sale at the Mohegan Sun Casino in Uncasville, Connecticut, June 21-24. Among the lots offered was an Alfa destined to make devotees of the tipo 116 Alfetta platform weep with joy, or perhaps faint in shock.

The car in question was a 1979 Alfetta Sprint Veloce, in the traditional Alfa red, with slate fabric upholstery. The few pictures and auction description of this last-U.S.-model-year coupe suggest that this was no ordinary beater Alfetta, being an original one-owner car that had spent its life in and out of a temperature-controlled garage.

Mileage isn't given, but judging from the interior and engine compartment photos, whatever miles were put on were traveled gently. The engine looks like it just escaped the showroom and the interior is showing only minor wear. A later radio is fitted.



Apparently, the car looked as good in person as it did in the photos, Someone wanted it badly enough to pay \$22,000, not a world record, but four times more than the median Alfetta fetches at auction.
